Day 1 Time To Teach: The Source for Classroom Management

Friday, August 6, 2010

In this session, educators, administrators, parents and paraprofessionals will learn powerful and highly effective strategies for eliminating 80-90% of **low-level** misbehaviors in the classroom grades K-12. These strategies work! No more gimmicky tricks, plea-bargaining or bribing students to behave. Participants will be shown how schools can transform their environments and stop wasting time on pesky misbehaviors. Participants will learn five key components:

- How to build relationships with students
- Analyze and improve the learning environment
- Maintain self control when challenged
- Explicitly teach expectations for success
- Effectively consequent misbehaviors

Participants will be shown how to be authoritative and eliminate multiple warnings and repeated requests, which will result in more Time To Teach! Through lecture, interactive activities and discussion, educators will learn strategies they can bring back to their classroom tomorrow! Participants will walk away with a new skill set for responding to power struggles; organizing learning environments effectively; a blue print for teaching expectations explicitly and systematically; as well as the most powerful tool for how to consequent misbehavior early and effectively and have students take responsibility for their own behavior.

We will revisit the five key components to answer questions and address issues brought up when implementing Time To Teach in your classroom. This is an interactive session designed to help you modify your own approach to improving your classroom management skills. Scenarios will be talked through and attendees given additional time to ask questions, perfect their methods and discuss issues occurring in their own classroom. This session will rely heavily on practice and simulations to help attendees perfect their techniques. We will also be viewing video examples of various situations to show how Time To Teach can be implemented in different settings.
