**S**uccess in school involves having the skills to do grade-level work, staying organized, getting along with kids and adults, and following rules. For kids with identified disabilities, the Individualized Education Program (IEP), or a 504 Plan,

details the supports and services to be provided for a student so that he/she is successful.

This workshop, offered by State Support Team 13, will provide examples of behavior and academic IEP goals and services. Whether the problem is related to sensory issues, grade-level skills, social needs, or organizational skills such as completing assignments, effective IEP goals and services can make the difference between success and failure!

Beginning with a brief overview of the connection between the Evaluation Team Report (ETR) and the IEP, practitioners (teachers and specialists) will share IEP goals and services, developed and implemented, for real kids in real classrooms. Family members will receive information and resources to assist in developing an effective IEP, or 504 Plan, for **any** child.
