Getting Started: Building Skills and Learning Strategies for Working with Your Child with ASD

This day-long workshop is for families whose child has been diagnosed with an ASD within the past year. The workshop covers basic information about Autism Spectrum Disorders, community and financial resources, family coping, and some basic intervention strategies. A short lunch break will be provided. When Behavior Is a Challenge

This day-long workshop is for families who want strategies for working with their child with ASD, including a focus on positive ways of dealing with behaviors. A short lunch break will be provided. Topics in Behavior: Feeding Problems in Children with ASD

This 2-hour session will address the following topics: common feeding problems in children with ASD, practical tips to address feeding problems, and evidence-based behavioral intervention procedures used to treat feeding problems. **The class will be Wednesday, March 21st, from 4 to 6PM, 5th floor, 3430 Burnet Ave.**

Understanding Behavior

This 2-day workshop is for professionals who work with individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorders. The focus of the workshop will be on fundamental behavioral principles. **There is a \$50 fee per participant** to cover the cost of a book and supplemental materials.
